In the summer of 2012 we moved our family of four from Alberta to Naramata. Having lived in Alberta for 17 years, suffering through long cold winters and a near-absence of any significant body of water, the lure of the Okanagan was obvious. While we weren't in the Naramata catchment [when he entered Kindergarten], we chose to send Joshua to Naramata for a couple of reasons. First of all, it was the same driving time as going to Uplands from our driveway.

But more importantly, the smaller size of Naramata Elementary turned out to be a huge advantage. Often it resulted in smaller classes. And while I was originally hesitant about split classes which occurred in some of the years, our son excelled regardless as to whether he was the higher or lower grade in the split. One of the resulting effects of the multi-grade classes, is the school became a community, not separated by grades. Kids of all grades and ages interacted and considered themselves 'friends', even if they were in a different grade.

The school truly is the anchor of that community and provides a base and forum for tons of community connection and fun.

Joshua's friends today (in grade 10) are the same 3 kids from the little Naramata School, from multiple grades. I feel this cohesive group of kids provide a nice haven within the bigger middle & high school environment.

Community Garden

Located right on the school grounds, the community garden is tended by local citizens, but shared with the school.

Naramata is one of just three communities in BC that have been celebrating May Day continuously for nearly a century. Each May, with the support of teachers and community members, the school children partake in the dancing and other events like the Soap Box Derby.

Fundraising activities for the school also involve music and dance, including the annual "Naramata's Got Talent" where community members vie with kids and everyone shows their artistic spirit (from serious to downright silly, of course).

PAC meetings are held the second Wednesday of every month, 7 pm in the school library, during the school year. All parents are welcome, and childcare is always available.

A Safe & Caring Community

Naramata has long enjoyed a reputation for being a safe and caring place for all children. With a smaller population than any of the other schools in the Okanagan/Skaha School District, each child is known by name, by each teacher and support staff member, and by each other. It is a school where a Kindergarten child can ask a Grade 5 child for help, where a Grade 4 child can walk to the community store and know that she or he will be greeted and assisted.
